

RE: Request for attorney general's opinion regarding issuance of criminal trespass notice for public property

Dear Attorney General Abbott:

Pursuant to Tex. Gov't Code §402.043, I respectfully request that you provide this office with a formal written opinion regarding the following questions:

- 1. Does a governmental entity's issuance of a criminal trespass notice against a person forbidding that person's entry upon property open to the public and owned by the governmental entity pursuant to Tex. Pen. Code §30.05 violate the person's constitutional rights?
- 2. If a governmental entity may issue a criminal trespass notice against a person forbidding that person's entry upon property open to the public and owned by the governmental entity, what criteria or conditions would the governmental entity need to satisfy so as to pass constitutional muster?
